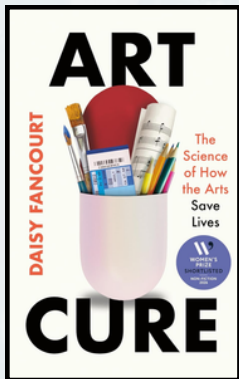

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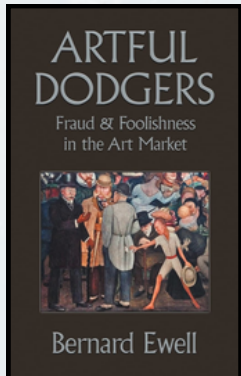

Choose your own book exploring the topic of aboriginal art created by indigenous Australians and share what you discover during this book club meeting!



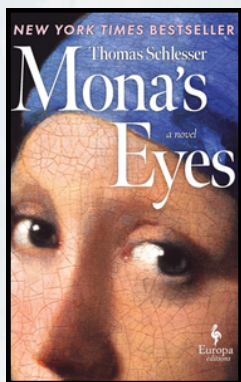
